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Washing Machine and Wash Cycles

- 1. Domestic Top Loader Fischer & Paykel
- Front Loader Wascator FOM 71 Lab MP.

Both machines used a warm wash cycle at 40°C.

The washing program for the Top Loader was the standard 40°C wash cycle.

The cycle in the Wascator was:

- > 2 minute cold rinse
- 8 minute wash at $40^{\circ}\text{C} \rightarrow \text{detergent}$ added at start of wash cycle
- > 3 rinses

the top loader and the front loader. The removal of *E.coli* was 99.89%. The slightly lower value for *E.coli* is probably due to the lower inoculum and lower recovery of *E.coli* on the swatch prior to washing. None of the target organisms were detected after washing and washing and drying. A greater than 99.9% removal of S. aureus and Proteus vulgaris was achieved by Clinic in both
